

North Mississippi Health Services (NMHS) is the largest hospital in Mississippi and the largest rural hospital in the United States. The Tupelo center and its other campuses and clinics serve 730,000 residents in a 24-county region that stretches throughout northern Mississippi and into parts of Alabama and Tennessee.

The Tupelo main campus has 750 beds, a staff of 350 doctors and 4,300 employees and includes a cancer center, heart institute, surgical services, diagnostic imaging, emergency department, behavioral health, and women's and children's services.

NMHS provides acute, diagnostic, therapeutic and emergency services, with the sole trauma center (Level 2) in our service area, through North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo. The health care system also includes community hospital locations in Amory, Eupora, luka, Pontotoc and West Point, Miss., and Hamilton Ala., a regional network of more than 45 primary and specialty clinics; nursing homes and telehealth services.

The hospital has also earned several awards in recent years, American Heart Association Mission: Lifeline Gold (2015), Malcolm Baldridge Qualtiy Award (2012, 2006), and America's top health systems by Modern Healthcare (2012) to name a
