Lee County Schools

The Lee County School District consists of thirteen schools and a center for academic improvement serving K-12. Campuses are located in Belden, Guntown, Mooreville, Plantersville, Saltillo, Shannon, and Verona. Over 7,100 students are currently enrolled in all programs offered throughout the district.

Tupelo Public School District

The Tupelo Public School District (TPSD) ranks 16th out of 147 districts in our state, boasting a graduation rate of over 80%. Currently there are over 7,500 students enrolled in all programs. TPSD provides a superior educational path phasing in the new MS College & Career Readiness standards in grades Pre-K through 12th. On campus there are 16 different languages spoken by members of our student body.
